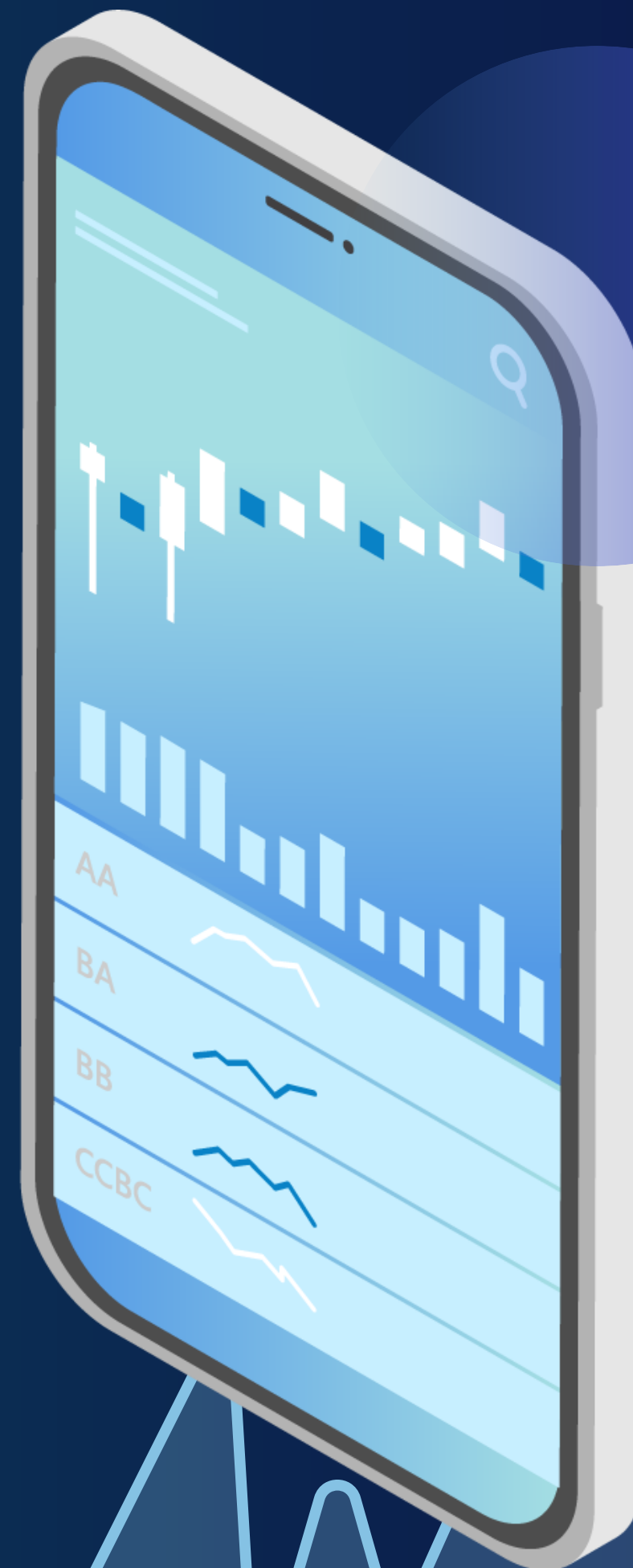


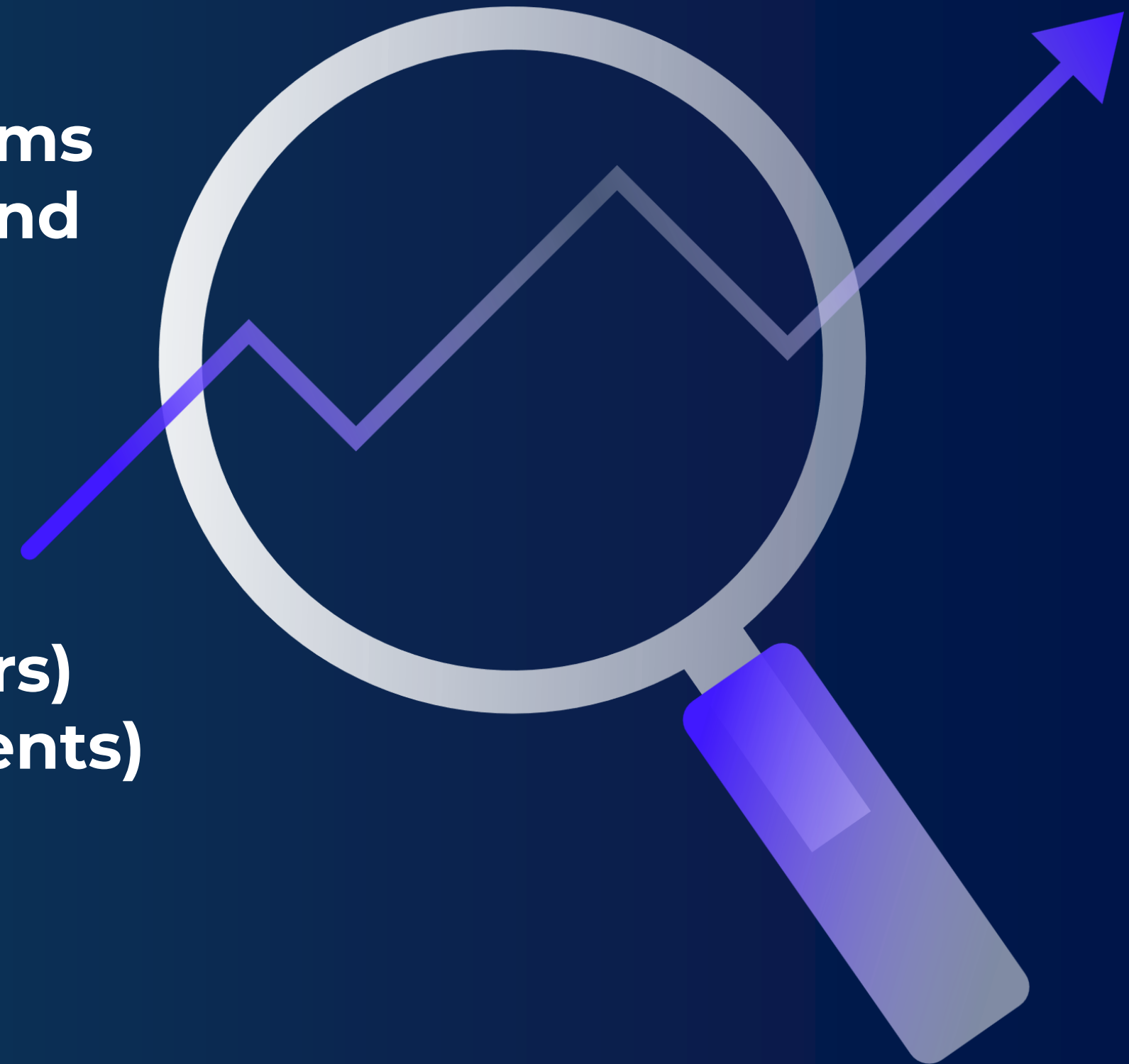
Financial Market Analysis



What are financial markets ?

Financial markets are platforms or systems where people and institutions can buy and sell financial assets like stocks, bonds, currencies, and derivatives

They help in the efficient allocation of resources by connecting investors (savers) with borrowers (businesses or governments) who need capital

- ✓ **When you buy a share, you own a small part of that company**
- ✓ **If the company does well, the value of your share can go up, and you can earn a profit by selling it**

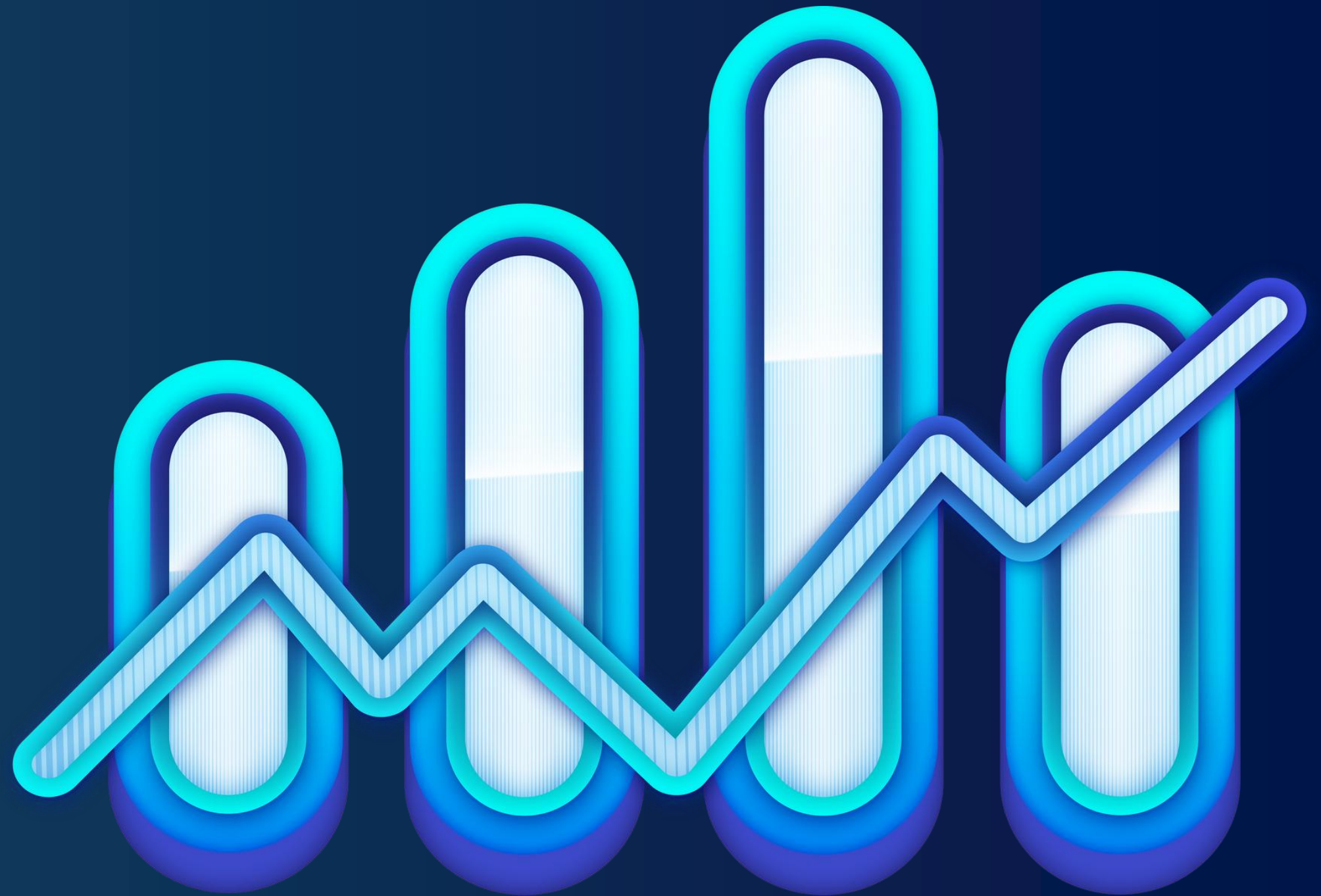

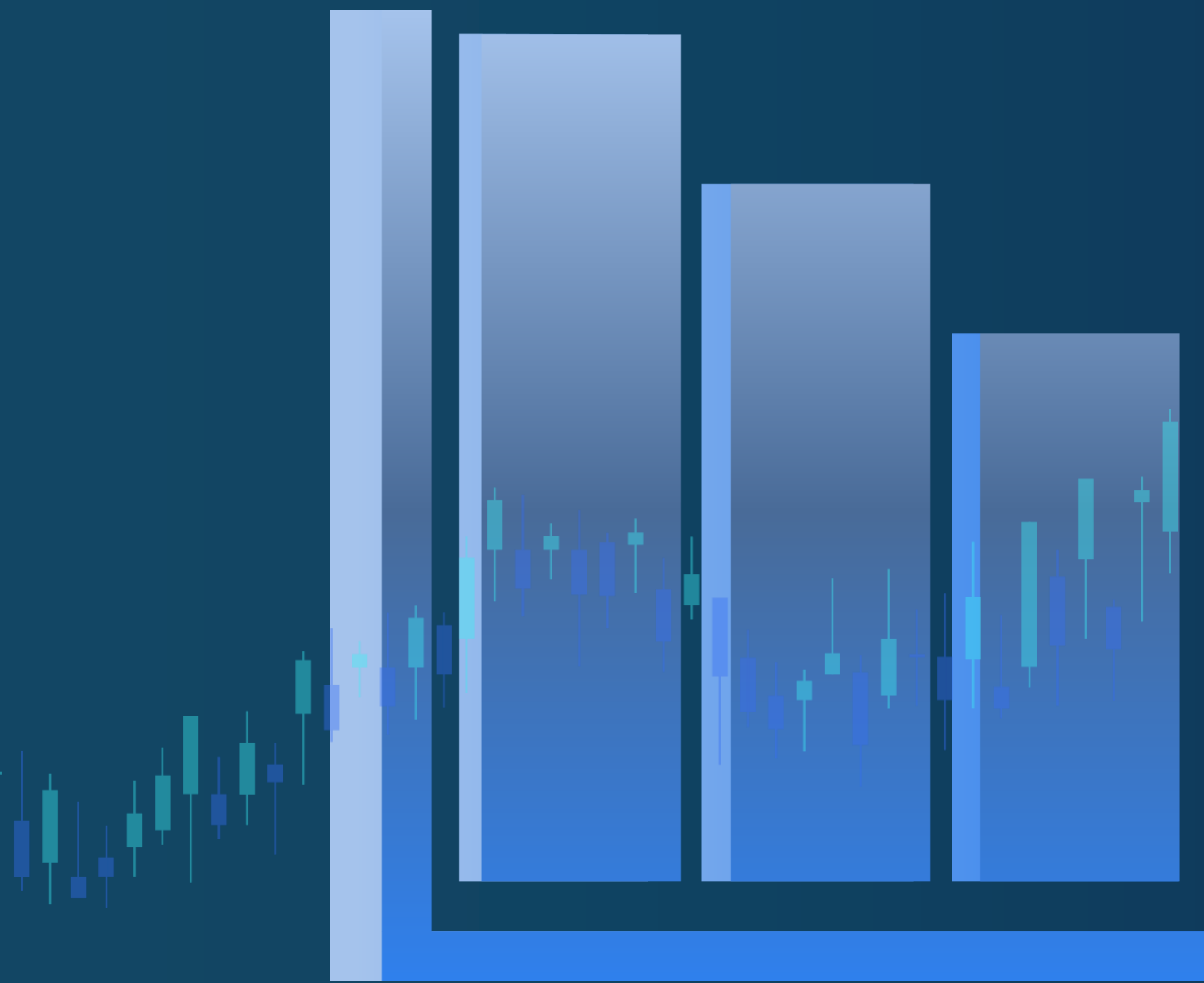
